

<p><u>Let's make maths!</u> Try to make a balance scale using a hanger, string and two cups.</p> 	<p><u>Let's play maths!</u> Collect 7 small objects from your home. Guess which one is the heaviest and the lightest. Hold each object. Make a list of them in order of weight. Check by weighing your objects using scales. Are larger objects always heavier?</p>	<p><u>Be grateful!</u> Give thanks for the good things in your life. Make a gratitude jar for your family. Add a note about something you are grateful for every day.</p> 	<p><u>Let's spell with colour!</u> Our spelling patterns are 'air' 'are' 'ph' 'wh'. Can you write out your spellings using a different colour for our patterns like we have done in class?</p> <p><i>pair wheel</i></p>	<p><u>Let's spell red words!</u> Watch the 'Tricky Words' song on YouTube. Can you read the tricky words? <p><u>Week 1 Making Choices</u> <i>Find our new RE topic sheet and week 1 pictures on Y1 home learning page.</i> <b>Tell</b> a children's story about making a wrong choice (there are several on Youtube). <b>Talk</b> about how sometimes we make good choices (good for others and for ourselves) and sometimes we make wrong choices which make others and ourselves unhappy. It is sometimes hard to say sorry when you have made a wrong choice and it can be hard to forgive someone else when their choice hurts you. <b>Look</b> at the pictures online – can you say which pictures show good choices and why? <b>Draw</b> your own good choice/bad choice picture and tell the story of what is happening in your picture.</p>	<p><u>Let's be Gymnasts</u> Can you balance on different parts of your body for 5 seconds? Do you remember the stories about Jesus we have read this year?</p> 	<p><u>Being a child in mining times</u> Watch this virtual gallery for a couple of minutes (from 11:00) <a href="https://bit.ly/Y1Cornish">https://bit.ly/Y1Cornish</a>. What do Norman Cornish's paintings show about life as a child in a mining town in the 50s and 60s? Make a list about being a child then and now. What is the same/different?</p>
<p><u>Can plants grow in water?</u> Save 1cm off the top of a carrot and put on a plate with a little water. Check daily, keep the bottom of the carrot wet and observe. Measure and record the length of the leaves every day. Can you grow and compare different root vegetables?</p> 	<p><u>DT</u> Draw a design and make a tiny food monster! Give your monster a rating on our emoji scale.</p>  	<p><u>Environment – Food Waste Campaign</u> Watch the 'Life of a Strawberry' video on YouTube. Can you explain to someone else what the video shows about food waste? <b>Where in the world</b> does your food come from? Have a look on the labels of your food. See if you can label a map showing where your food has come from or make a list. Do you notice any patterns? Is it better to eat food grown in the UK? Why/Why not?</p> 		<p><u>Where in the world are, we?</u> Use Google Earth to look at the United Kingdom from space or find maps at home. Can you find the United Kingdom? Zoom in until you can see hills, rivers, towns, cities, fields, forests and other smaller islands. Write about what you can see: 'I can see...'. Why is it called the United Kingdom?</p>
