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THE CALL OF SAMUEL (based on Samuel 2:11; 3:3-10)

When Samuel was old enough he went to Shiloh to stay with Eli and grew up in the service of God. One night when Samuel was asleep he heard someone calling him. He jumped up quickly and ran to Eli. "Here I am," he said.

Eli answered, "I did not call you; go back to bed."

Samuel did as Eli said. Then he heard someone calling him again. So he got up, went to Eli and said, "You called me; here I am."

Eli said again, "I did not call you; go back to bed."

Samuel heard someone calling him a third time. He got up, went to Eli and said again, "You called me; here I am."

Eli realised that it was God who was calling Samuel. This time he said, "Go back to bed. If you hear the voice again, say, 'Speak Lord, I am listening'." So Samuel went back to bed. When the voice called again, 'Samuel, Samuel,' he answered, "Speak Lord I am listening."

GOD'S PROPHET (based on 1 Samuel 3:19-21 and 1 Samuel 8:1-6, 10, 22)

As Samuel grew up, God was always close to him and Samuel always listened to God's word. He became God's prophet and the people listened to what he had to say.

When Samuel grew old he made his sons Judges in Israel. Samuel's sons did not follow his example. They did not listen to God's word. The people asked Samuel to give them a king. "Look," they said, "you are old and your sons do not follow your example. So give us a king to rule us, like the other nations."

Samuel listened to all they had to say and then prayed to God. God said to Samuel, "Do as they ask and give them a king."

THE FIRST KING (based on 1 Samuel 10:1 and 1 Samuel 15:10, 24; 16:1)

God chose Saul to be the first king of Israel. Samuel took some oil and poured it on Saul's head. He kissed him and said, "God has anointed you as king of God's people Israel."

But Saul did not listen to God's word. He was afraid of the people and did what they wanted, not what God wanted. God was sorry that he had made Saul king. God sent Samuel to find a new king for Israel.

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DAVID IS CHOSEN (based on 1 Samuel 16:4-13)

Samuel went to Bethlehem. A man named Jesse, who had eight sons, lived there.

When he saw Eliab, the eldest of the sons, Samuel thought that he must be the one God had chosen. God said to Samuel, "Take no notice of his height. I have not chosen him. I do not see as human beings see. They look at appearances, I look at the heart."

Jesse then called Abinadab, but God had not chosen him. Next he called Shammah, but God had not chosen him either. Jesse presented seven of his sons to Samuel.

Samuel said to Jesse, "God has not chosen any of these. Are they all the sons you have?"

Jesse answered, "There is one left, the youngest; He is looking after the sheep."

Samuel asked Jesse to send for him. When David arrived Samuel took some oil and anointed him in front of his brothers. God blessed David and was close to him.
